## The SVJOUR document class users guide supplement for Mathematical Programming

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## 1 Introduction

This document describes the *matprg* option for the SVJOUR  $\text{LATEX} 2_{\mathcal{E}}$  document class. For details on manuscript handling and the reviewing process we refer to the *Instructions for authors* which can be found at the Intertnet address http://link.springer.de/link/service/journals/10107/index.htm via the link "About this Journal" and in the printed journal. For style matters please consult previous issues of the journal.

## 2 Initializing the class

As explained in the main *Users guide* you can begin a document for *Mathematical Programming* by including

```
\documentclass[matprg]{svjour}
```

as the first line in your text. All other options are also described in the main  $Users \ guide.$ 

## 3 Changes to the SVJour class

The header information (typeset by using the command \maketitle) will be split on the first page so that the basic information relevant for the actual article appears at the top and addresses of the authors and additional material at the foot of the page.

For this purpose the footnote like affiliations made with \inst in the \author field have been withdrawn and the command \institute has been extended, according to the following scheme, so as to include the authors' names as well.

If more than one name/address combination is necessary, please use **\and** to separate them (the name of a particular author may well appear in more than one of these).

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**Running head on the last page.** If the last page happens to be an evennumbered left/verso page, there will be the option of creating a combined running head, consisting of name(s) (initials/name of single author or names of two authors, initials/name of first author + et.al. in the case of three or more authors) and the running title. The headline that is automatically generated may be too long to fit into the space available. In this case, you will be asked to formulate a shorter version of the running title and insert this using the command

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
